Maths and Numeracy

- Practise your number bonds, doubling and halving of numbers.

- Practice making a number.

- Continue to develop your confidence counting in 2's, 5's and 10's. Try starting at a variety of different numbers.

This Week's Focused Learning

Halves and doubles:

Recall near doubles to 10 (4+5 is very close to 4+4. Students can easily recall that the **double** fact for 4+4=8 and by adding one more, they quickly know that 4+5=9). Try this for all numbers to 10 and record in your exercise book. You could upload a picture to seesaw if you wish.

Language, Literacy and Communication

- Practise your spelling of all Tricky Words. Can you write a variety of different sentences using these tricky words?

This Week's Focused Learning

Language, Literacy and Communication:

- Look at a variety of postcards online and discuss what a postcard is, why we send postcards and what the features of a postcard are.
- Write a postcard to a person of your choice (remember to draw a picture on one side and include name and address in the correct place etc.). **Template**
- Revise the question: Sut mae'r tywydd? **And answer using the sentence: Mae hi'n heulog etc.** There is a sheet to accompany this activity on seesaw.



Science and Technology

- Make collections of different materials e.g. shiny, see-through, hard, soft, rough and smooth.
- Look at different materials/fabrics and use senses to describe properties of these materials, close your eyes to help you describe the texture. Write down words to describe each material (e.g. soft, flexible, rough etc.).
- Using your HWB login can you go to Just2easy and then Jit 5 and then into paint and draw a picture of the instrument you have created

Expressive Arts

- Can you draw a portrait of one of the members of your family using observational drawing (Look at their individual features e.g. eyes, nose, mouth, ears, hair etc.).
